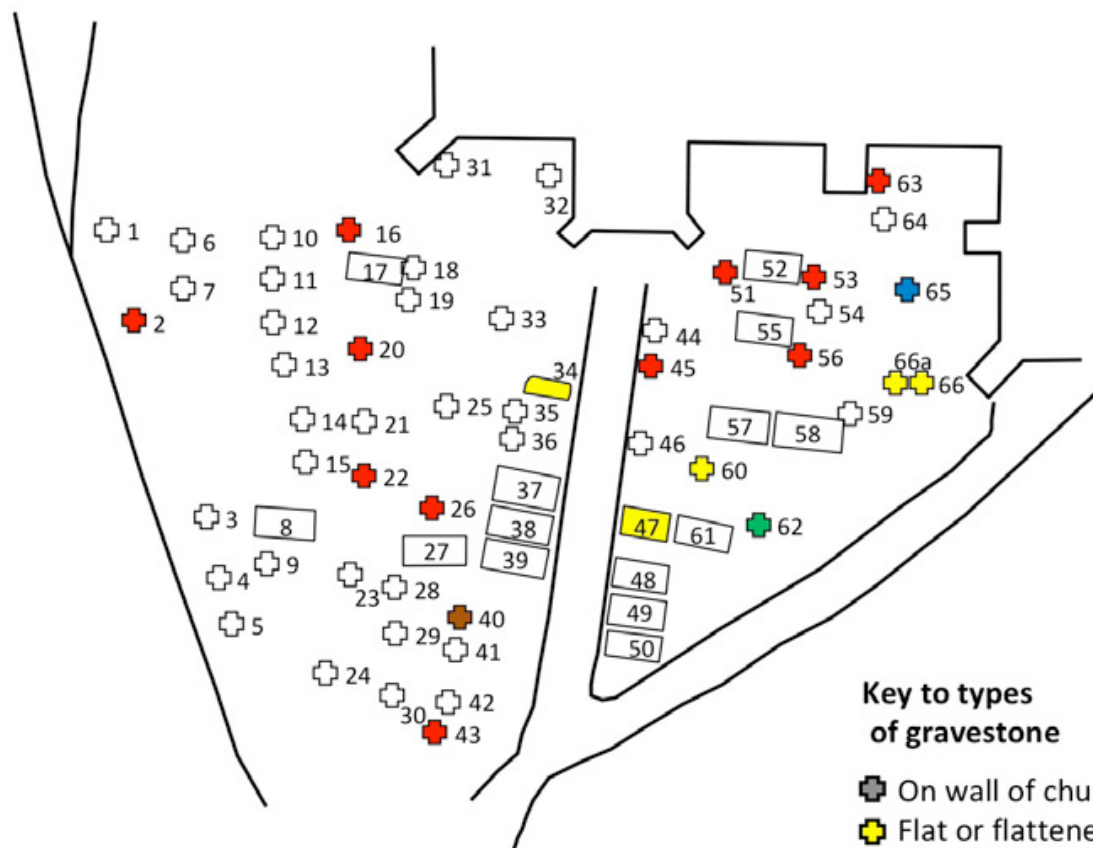

Notes

The church of St Mary's stands on the site of an earlier building, which was dedicated to St Nicholas. The date of erection of this earlier church is not known, but in a record of 1164 there is mentioned "Robert the parson of Bigir of the Church of St Nicholas," During the restoration of St Mary's in 1935 traces of the earlier church were discovered, among them a piscina, which was set up in the restored building. In 1545-6 Malcolm, Lord Fleming, whose family had long been powerful landowners in the district, founded a Collegiate Church, the last in Scotland, and dedicated it to the Virgin Mary. It is this building, altered and restored, which stands today. The Flemings were buried in the church, but subsequent alterations and repairs must have disturbed their repose. The male line of the Flemings came to an end in the 18th century, when Lady Clementina Fleming carried the estates into the family of Elphinstone. The only pre-1855 memorial inscription inside the church is the wall tablet to Jane Mercer, wife of the Hon. George Keith Elphinstone, who died in. 1789.

Mr Brian Lambie, late Director of Biggar Museums, supplied the following notes on the inscriptions:-

No.36 - The father, unnamed on the stone, was James Minto, who left his wife. The local masonic minutes record that he was charged in 1795 with behaving in a brutal manner to her. William Minto, mason, built a great many of the houses in Biggar in the 1830s and worked on the policy walls of Biggar Park, using stones from Boghall Castle. The uninscribed flat stone to the right is supposed to mark the burial place of Johnnie Minto the carrier and Katie his wife. Johnnie and his cart appear in Pairman's sketch of Biggar Cross Knowe, reproduced in "Biggar and the House of Fleming."

No 49 - The Rev David Smith and his wife, the aunt of Dr John Brown., parents of the children recorded here, lie across the way in the shadow of the Moat Park Church Tower. Other members of the family (including Nancy for whom "Rab and his Friends" was written) are buried in the new cemetery.

No 46 - Robert Pairman's 2nd wife is buried with her first husband, George Gladstone, at Coulter, A MS account of the family by a grandson, Dr Thomas Pairman, New Zealand,

Is in existence and the museum trustees hope to publish this, supplemented by other information which they possess. Brief references to Robert and John and Br Robert appear in "Biggar and the House of Fleming."

Nos 52 & 55 - Bethia Scott was da of Wm Scott mert Edinburgh and Jane Crawford descendant of 1st Earl of Arran, Anne Lawson was da of John Lawson of Cairnmuir (see History of Peeblesshire by J.W.Buchan iii 156) and descendant of James II. .

No.62 – Kello family - founders of the local hospital. George Kello senior's parents buried at Quothquan - his mother a member of the Gladstone family. Mrs Kello's family, the Lintons, buried at Broughton. The wills of Simon Kello (1906) and Jessie G,Kello (1916) contain many references to relatives at home and abroad.

No.65 - Thomas Pairman was the marker for the local Volunteer Corps and was accidentally shot by Lt Lockhart at the Bizzyberry Rifle Range.

No.67 (large flat stone to N.E. of no.68) - this stone gets overgrown and "re-discovered" from time to time. The remains of the inscription are - Here lyes Thomas Steil sc..l...e in N... who died IUL 19 1899 age 57. The 6 is probably a re-cut 6, although it could be a 5. Some people have thought the date is 1099, although, of course, Arabic numerals were not in use in country churchyards then.

No.70 - Isabella Clark, Mrs Masterton, was a Clark of Carnwath, a family long established there and still represented. This stone is the oldest tombstone of the Masterton family, long resident in Biggar. One of their number was grandfather to the author John Buchan, Lord Tweedsmuir.

Nos.86 & 134 - A fair account of the Gladstone family appears in "Biggar and the House of Fleming." The early history of the family has been extensively researched and a great many accounts try to tie in with the Roxburghshire branches of the family. The Biggar family are descended from the Gladstones of Arthursiels who are more than likely themselves descended from the Gladstones of Gladstone. The Arthursiels branch appears about the end of the 15th century and various members appear in local records/ By 1541 William Gladstone appears to be the senior Arthursiels Gladstone, and the testament of his widow Janet Brown survives (1670). Her son William predeceased her (1662) leaving a widow and two "bairns," John and David, who is assumed to be the founder of the Coulter branch of the family. A younger son of William Gladstone senior (John) appears to be the ancestor of William Gladstone, the first of the Biggar branch of the family, and the last to be buried in the old family ground at Libberton. The "new" church there is supposed to have obliterated this, but in 1968 part of a wall-mounted tombstone appeared among building material at Biggar Mill. It is quite possible that this was taken away as rubble when the church was rebuilt. It refers to two burials, but insufficient remains of the inscription to identify either - though they are possibly William Gladstone and his son James. The dates of death are 1727 and 1760, the former corresponding with Hunter's note in "Biggar and the House of Fleming." In a MS account of the family in 1855, James Wyld Gladstone, son of the watchmaker, refers to there being only the Biggar and Coulter families in the locality, and goes on, "Respecting the Coulter family it may be remarked that their traditions and Christian names are identical with those of the Biggar family and their facial developments have also so much similarity as to be strikingly indicative of the same paternity."

The museum possesses fuller details of the family than those published in "Biggar and the House of Fleming," with much about related local families, including Aitkens, Grahams, Kellos, Tweedies, Coshes, Somervilles, Waughs, Steels, Afflecks., &c. Standard peerage works have fuller details on the family of Sir John Gladstone 3rd and his son William Ewart Gladstone.

Early references to members of the family appear in Records of Carnwath Barony Court (Scottish History Society); Protocol Book of Gilbert Grote (Scottish Record Society); Shieldhill Charters,

No.103 - This obelisk gives details of a number of descendants of the Cree family, buried in another part of the churchyard. Two portraits of Mrs Thomson are in Gladstone-Court, one circa 1805 and the other in extreme old age. She was a daughter of Matthew Cree, Baron Bailie. The Harlands are related through Mrs Harland's grandmother, who was a Cree, her father- James Watt, millwright, was an important member of the community in the middle of the 19th century, and is quite likely buried here, though no record exists. Copies of the Cree and Watt family papers can be consulted in the museum,

No.85A in JSSS - flat stone near no. 39, not now visible. The inscription was noted by Whitfield* in 1885 - Here lyes Thomc.3 Forrest, miller in Biggar Mill who died 19 August 1/03 aged 57, (The will of John Forrest, miller, is registered 1728.) * Rev W.Whitfield - local historian, travelled extensively in North America, where he noted his visits to families who came from the district, MS3 and publications are in the museum.

No 126 - See testament of Thomas Gibson's sister-in-law in Scottish Record Office, which refers to him as "apothecary".

No. 127 - 'Children of Rev John Christison - 1851 census includes son James b 1837- 1861 census, Catherine Hunter was wife of English teacher - 1871 census gives Charles h 1847 rail contractor. • The Rev J.W.Stevenson in "God and my Unbelief" recalls the tale of Dr Christopher" and his search for a son in London. This is based on an experience in the life of Dr Christison,

No.104A in JSSS - Alexander Steel senior was known as "Auld Sandy Steel," and was a Radical. Several anecdotes about the family are in the Whitfield (see note on no.85A in JSSS) papers.

No.142 - Alexander Sinclair was schoolmaster at Lamington and his death and burial at Biggar are recorded in the Lamington Register.

No.129 - John Smith's version of this worn inscription has been corrected according to an insertion in the "Hamilton Advertiser" 26.9.1885.

No.131 - The testaments of both Cosh and his wife are in the Scottish Record Office. The latter has a full and interesting account of household plenishings and clothing. Their daughter-in-law was a Gladstone and fuller details are among the Gladstone papers, (see note on no.63)

No.170 - Mrs Robertson was a descendant of the Tweedie family (no.12) and a relative of the Gladstones, Her daughter-in-law Christina Pairman, Mrs Matthew Robertson junior was also a relative of the Gladstone family, A descendant of the Robertson family was George Blake the author, The Blakes (no. 380) are probably other relatives of his. Fuller details in Gladstone Court.

No.239 - Mrs Thorburn, Marion Brown, was daughter of William Brown and Helen Watt (no. 182)s relatives of the Watts and Crees.

Nos.179, 181, 182 - Photographs and records of this large family of Browns exist at Biggar Museum, The parents of Mrs James Brown, Margaret Tweedie (no.182) are buried at Symington, Her mother was- -one-of the Coulter Gladstones, (see note on no.86)

No.283 - Thomas Ord. famous equestrian performer - scarce life-story booklet (c.1900) in Gladstone Court, together with numerous cuttings, Son-in-law Edwin Pinder's famous circus performed before Queen "Victoria several times. No.298 - A humorous account of Widow Kennedys courtship with Dr Summers (no,294) is preserved in the museum. Mary Kennedy, daughter of the saddler, was Mary London, who opened Glasgow's first Beauty Parlour in 1918. Another member of the family was William Kennedy, founder of the Broxburn Oil Co. (1336-1899), a portrait of whom appears in "The Bailie" of July 1396.

No.296 - "May" Hope's school exercise books are now in' • Gladstone Court Museum.

No.308 - Obituary in "Hamilton Advertiser" 1834 gives Jane Reid's age at death as 78,

No.329 - Walter Gray married Marion Swan of Skirling (Skirling Parish Register), probably a relative of the Swans in no. 258 . A photograph of him and the local tinsmith, William "Tinny" Calder was a best-selling carte- da visits in the. early 1860s. Tinny is buried at Libberton.

No.335 - Miss Bella Borthwick, for many years infant mistress at Biggar was buried to the right centre of her ancestors' stone in 1964. Her parents and sister are recorded on no 333.

No. 377 - The parents of Rev W.B. Clark and Eliza , wife of Rev Henry Scott Riddell the Border poet
